Great Lent 2022

This year **Great Lent** begins on Monday February 28. Also known as the **Great Fast**, it is a great reflection on life and death. The readings of each Sunday encourages us to take a critical look at ourselves. What motivates our actions? (Laws or Love?) How do we see others? (With condemnation or compassion?) During Great Lent our goal is to focus on our relationship with God. The Fast is not about diet; it is about doing what it takes us personally to bring our consciousness into harmony and awareness of the Divine presence in our lives. Our liturgical services support and sustain our personal journeys by praying together as a community, through the readings, and hymns.

The Forty Days of Great Lent commemorates Israel's forty years of wandering in the Wilderness, the forty years of struggle as Israel longed for and then received entrance into the Promised Land. (Ex. 16:35) Moses remained fasting on Mt. Sinai for forty days. (Ex. 34:28) The Prophet Elijah fasted for forty days as he journeyed to Mt. Horeb (1 Kings 19:8). Great Lent also recalls the forty days the Lord spent in the Wilderness after His Baptism, when He resisted Satan.

The time of Great Lent encompasses forty days, to which brings us to Holy Week, beginning with Lazarus Saturday and Palm Sunday. In addition, the Church prescribed several weeks of pre-Lenten Sundays: Zacchaeus, the Publican and the Pharisee, Prodigal Son, Meatfare (Last Judgment) and Cheesefare (Forgiveness). Each Sunday has prepared us for Great Lent, our journey to Pascha (Easter).

During Great Lent the **Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts** will be celebrated on Wednesdays. **Way of the Cross** will be prayed on Fridays. **Sorokousty**, prayers for the deceased, will be celebrated on All Soul Saturdays, March 12, 19, 26. There are two additional All Souls Saturdays. One was celebrated yesterday, Feb.19. The remaining one will be celebrated on the Saturday before Pentecost, June 4.

Sunday of Meat-fare February 20, 2022

Tropar, tone 6: Angelic powers were upon Your tomb* and the guards became like dead men;* Mary stood before Your tomb seeking Your most pure body.* You captured Hades without being overcome by it.* You met the Virgin and granted life.* O Lord, risen from the dead, glory be to You.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and forever and ever. Amen!

Kondak of Meat-fare, tone 3: O God, when You come to earth in all Your glory,* when all things will tremble, when the river of fire will flow before Your judgment seat,* when the books will be opened and when what is secret will be revealed;* then save me from the unquenchable fire,* and grant that I may stand at Your right hand, most just Judge.

Prokimen, tone 3: Great is our Lord and mighty in power; to his wisdom there is no limit.

Verse: *Praise the Lord, for he is good; sing praise to our God, for he is gracious; it is fitting to praise him.*

Epistle: A reading from the first Letter of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Corinthians
Brothers and Sisters! Now food does not bring us closer to God. We suffer no loss through failing to eat, and we gain no favor by eating. Take care, however, lest in exercising your right you become an occasion of sin to the weak. If someone sees you, with your 'knowledge,' reclining at table in the temple of an idol, may not his conscience in its weak state be influenced to the point that he eats the idol-offering? Because of your 'knowledge' the weak one perishes, that brother for whom Christ dies. When you sin thus against your brothers and wound their weak consciences, you are sinning against Christ. Therefore, if food causes my brother to sin I will never eat meat again, so that I may not be an occasion of sin to him. Am I not free? Am I not an apostle? Have I not seen Jesus our Lord? And are you not my work in the Lord Although I may not be an apostle for others, I certainly am one for you. You are the very seal of my apostolate in the Lord.

Alleluia Verses: *Come, let us sing joyfully to the Lord, let us acclaim God, our Savior.*

Let us come before His face with praise, and acclaim Him in psalms.

Gospel: Matthew 25:31-46

The Lord said: "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, escorted by all the angels of heaven, he will sit upon his royal throne, and all the nations will be assembled before him. Then he will separate them into two groups, as a shepherd separates sheep from goats. The sheep he will place on his right hand, the goats on his left.

The king will say to those on his right: 'Come. You have my Father's blessing! Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the creation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food. I was thirsty and you gave me drink. I was a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me. I was ill and you comforted me, in prison and you came to visit me.' then the just will ask him: 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you or see you thirsty and give you drink? When did we welcome you away from home or clothe you in your nakedness? When did we visit you when you were ill or in prison?' The king will answer them: 'I assure you, as often as you did it for one of my least brothers, you did it for me.'

Then he will say to those on his left: 'Out of my sight, you condemned, into that everlasting fire prepared for the devil and his angels! I was hungry and you gave me no food. I was thirsty and you gave me no drink. I was away from home and you gave me no welcome, naked and you gave me no clothing. I was ill and in prison and you did not come to comfort me.' Then they in turn will ask: 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or away from home or naked or ill or in prison and not attend you in your needs?' He will answer them: 'I assure you, as often as you neglected to do it to one on these least ones, you neglected to do it to me.' These will go off to eternal punishment and the just to eternal life."

Communion Hymn: Praise the Lord from the heavens, Praise Him in the highest.

Exult, you just, in the Lord; praise from the upright is fitting. Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!
