

Life Culture

As stories of Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD) continue to make headlines, I thought it would be helpful to put into perspective how out of control MAiD is in Canada.

The state of California legalized MAiD in 2016, the same year as Canada. California and Canada also have approximately the same population – 39 million for California and 38 million for Canada. In 2021, 486 Californians died by MAiD

compared to 10,064 Canadians. What a tragedy for Canada.



The difference is that California has tighter parameters and only allows MAiD when someone has a terminal disease that is expected to result in death within six months. When it comes to MAiD in Canada, people are allowed to choose MAiD for much less, including reasons that are emotional and mental rather than physical.

Suffering, whether physical, mental, or emotional is not something anyone wants to experience. However, the proper response to suffering is to try eliminate the suffering, not the sufferer.


We can all play a role in supporting a culture of life by walking along side those that are suffering, advocating for better palliative care, and believing that all life has value and purpose until its natural end.
