Dear Parishioners.

In a few days, Canada will celebrate Remembrance Day. It is a day set aside to remember those who have given their lives for the freedom which we all share. True freedom always has a cost. Currently, our brothers and

sisters in Ukraine know this in a very direct and personal way. We, in Canada, enjoy the freedom that we have, because someone else has paid the price for this gift. Remembrance Day is a time to pause and remember that freedom comes with a cost.

One spiritual writer reminds his readers that in the Old Testament Book of Deuteronomy, Moses's farewell speech to the Israelites had the theme of *remembering*. It could be summed up in the following three short sentences: *Remember not to forget.* Don't forget to remember. Remember to remember. In other words, do not forget who you are and whose you are.

At every Divine Liturgy, when we receive Holy Communion, we remember who we are and whose we are. Jesus said, "Do this in remembrance of me". And as we do this, may we keep in mind the price that our Lord paid for us through the Cross, because of his great love for each and everyone of us.

Sometimes we forget who we are and whose we are because our minds and hearts are cluttered with worries and various concerns. Remembering can be described as "resetting" our hearts. From time to time, our computers need to be powered down in order to reset the speed and performance. In a similar way, we also need to power down, in order to remove the clutter from our hearts and minds. After a reset, knowing who we are and whose we are, we can undertake the act of remembering more completely.

The 70th Anniversary Cookbook has arrived!


Please come downstairs to the Parish Hall to pay for and receive your cookbook(s).



Feast of St. Michael the Archangel - November 8

The Feast of the Archangel Michael and the holy Angels indicates to us the significant role the Angels play in our salvation. Before the Lord God created man, He created the holy Angels who are invisible, immortal, perfect beings and pure spirits. Throughout our lives, our guardian angel watches over us, protects us, inspires us, warns us against sin, and intercedes for us before God. From this



comes our duty to venerate the holy Angels, to praise them, and to thank them every day for their assistance and protection. The praise of Saint Michael stems from the fact that in defense of God's glory he led all the good angels against the rebellion of Satan (Revelations 12:7-9). He is depicted both as a military leader clad in full armor and as a minister wearing the deacon's sticharion.

Feast of St. John Chrysostom - November 13

Our father among the saints, John Chrysostom (347-407), Archbishop of Constantinople, was a notable bishop and preacher from the fourth and fifth centuries in Syria and Constantinople. He was born in Antioch of noble parents: his father was a high-ranking military officer. He is famous for eloquence in public speaking, his denunciation of abuse of authority in the Church and in the Roman Empire of the time, and for a Divine Liturgy attributed to him. He had notable ascetic sensibilities. After his death he was named *Chrysostom*, which comes from the Greek, "goldenmouthed." The Church honors him as a saint (feast day, November 13) and counts him among the Three Holy Hierarchs (feast day, January 30), together with Saints Basil the Great and Gregory the Theologian.
