

# Presentation of the Mother of God in the Temple November 21



The Entrance of the Mother of God into the Temple, also called The Presentation, is one of the 12 Great Feasts of the Church, celebrated on November 21. Although this feast has no basis in history, it stresses an important truth about Mary: From the beginning of her life, she was dedicated to God. She herself became a greater temple than any made by hands. God came to dwell in her in a marvelous manner and sanctified her for her unique role in God's saving work. Mary was the only child of her parents Saint Anne and Saint Joachim. Though it was not obligatory to present a first-born daughter to the Lord, as it was with a first-born son, many Jewish parents did follow this custom. When Mary was presented, she was received by St. Zacharias, the father of St. John the Forerunner, as he was the High Priest at that time. Her presentation at the Temple meant that Mary later probably learned to read sacred Scripture & also to

write. This feast reminds us of our fundamental vocation, which is the call to holiness. We are all called to be holy. Like Mary, our first and foremost mission in this life is to live our lives to the fullest. To live a holy life is a tall order but it is not impossible. It is through God's grace that we can fulfill this vocation and mission. The Letter of Paul reminds us of this sublime reality: The grace of the Lord is enough for those who strive to live good and holy lives (cf. 2 Cor, 12:9).

**"Mary's Angels"** are again available before and after each Divine Liturgy on Saturday and Sunday. These angels are sold as a Christmas "in memoriam" project. Each angel is \$7.00 or 4 for \$25.00. A portion will go to the Marian Hour on 92.7 CKJS radio and the remaining portion will go for medical, winter gear etc. for the soldiers defending Ukraine against the Russian aggression. A Panahyda service for all the "in memoriam" names will be celebrated after the 5:00 pm Divine Liturgy on December 17<sup>th</sup>.



# Pylypivka - Traveling the Road to Bethlehem

### November 15- December 24

As Ukrainian Byzantine Catholics, our ancient practice of the 40-day preparation (Pylypivka) for Christmas begins the day after the feast of St. Philip, on November 15 and continues until Christmas Eve, December 24.

This short time recalls the long centuries during which God spoke to prophets, instructing how He wanted His people to prepare for the coming of His Son: they needed to repent, change their way of living, make peace with and care for each other, and be obedient and faithful to Him.

During this forty-day period we, too, are instructed to prepare for a greater awareness that "God is with us". Since the Pylypivka (also called Phillip's Fast or the Nativity Fast) is the preparation period for Christ's Birth, we can enhance its practice. Expanding upon the tradition of repentance and prayer during the pre-Christmas season can help us better appreciate our Christmas celebration, and realize it's deeper than just avoiding certain foods. You can renew the spirit of Pylypivka in your family by setting aside at least one day a week together and follow this suggested six-week plan.

#### Week one

Reflect on your faith by reading John 1:43-50. Jesus calls Phillip and Nathaniel to follow Him. Exchange ideas with your family about how you have had a personal experience with God, or how you could tell your friends about Jesus. Decide on a special project (e.g. a charitable act) you can do as a family.

### Week two

Most children are computer-savvy. Have them find the story of the Presentation of the Theotokos, (November 21), are read it together. Discuss how you encounter God in your Temple: would they invite their friends to join them in church? Find an expression of Repentance that would bring you all closer to God.

#### Week three

On November 30 we remember St Andrew who is known as the "First-Called" Apostle. Read John 1:35-42. Talk about your relationship with God, why you need Him in your life and where His presence is missing in our world today.

#### Week four

December 6 is the Feast of St. Nicholas, a saint called a wonder-worker with a special love for children and the poor. His life is an excellent example for us to follow if we want to learn how to care for and help one another. Discuss the story of St. Nicholas and how he helped many with the money his parents left him. Reflect on Luke 6:17-26 and what Jesus said. Howcan your family help the poor? What do your children think it would be like to be poor?

#### Week five

Sunday of the Ancestors of Jesus. This week focus on Exodus 1:8-22; 2:1- 10 and 3:1-12. Talk about how God chooses a mission for each one of us even before we are born. How might God be calling you to do His work?

## Week six

The Sunday before the Nativity of Jesus—the Sunday of the Holy Fathers our Church commemorates all people of all ages who pleased God. This is best shown in 1 Samuel 16:1-13, where the youngest is chosen by God. Emphasize that God asks all to spread His word and age, height, weight and looks do not matter for all are equal in God's eyes.

By following this six-week plan you will find that your celebration will be real, and your understanding enriched. The better we are prepared for anything in life, the better the final outcome. May we spiritually prepare for the great feast of the Nativity of Our Lord, and may our preparation bring us true and lasting spiritual joy!
