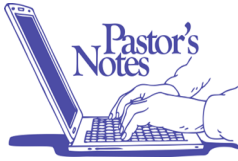

Christ is Born!



Dear Parishioners,

Often when a year is ending and a new one is about to begin, we are encouraged that we “ring out the old” and “ring in the new”. What are the origins of these phrases.

It used to be customary in England to “ring out” the Old Year at midnight on New Year's Eve by ringing church bells as if there was a funeral. Then when the clock hits midnight, the tone of the bells would change into a joyful ring to welcome in the new year. There is a poem, written in the 1850's by Lord Alfred Tennyson, that refers to this custom. Below are a few lines from this poem entitled *Ring Out, Wild Bells*.

*Ring out the old, ring in the new, Ring, happy bells, across the snow;
The year is going, let him go; Ring out the false, ring in the true
Ring in the love of truth and right, Ring in the common love of good.
Ring out old shapes of foul disease; Ring out the narrowing lust of gold;
Ring out the thousand wars of old, Ring in the thousand years of peace.
Ring in the valiant man and free, The larger heart, the kindlier hand;
Ring out the darkness of the land, Ring in the Christ that is to be.*

On Thursday evening and Friday morning, we celebrated a very important feast day, the Theophany of Our Lord, the Baptism of Jesus in the Jordan River by John the Baptist. Could this holy day be described as “ringing in the new”? After all, Jesus is now revealed to the whole world as the Saviour, the Messiah. It seems to be the start of something new. On the surface, this seems so, but after reflecting on this great mystery, it is easy to see that there is something more.

Jesus came not just to “ring in” something new. He came to restore God's original plan, that was derailed by the sin of Adam. The mission of the Saviour was to reverse the ancient curse. In other words, to “ring out” corruption, sin and death, and to “ring in” God's original plan, his original blessing.

The feast of Theophany invites each and everyone of us to partake in the “ringing out” of corruption and the “ringing in” of God's blessings, through renewal, restoration, and reconciliation. These themes are certainly reflected the prayers that were prayed during the solemn blessing of water that took place on this feast day. By being open to receive the graces of renewal, restoration, and reconciliation, we will help God “ring in” His original plan.
