Welcome Bishop Andriy Rabiy Auxiliary Bishop Archeparchy of Winnipeg to

Saínt Joseph's Ukraínían Catholíc Church



Bishop Andriy Rabiy was born on October 1, 1975, in the city of Lviv, Ukraine. In the fall of 1992 he entered Ivano-Frankivsk Seminary where he studied philosophy for two years. In August of 1994 he moved to the United States to continue his studies at St. Josaphat's Ukrainian Catholic Seminary while attending classes at the Catholic University of America in Washington DC.

He graduated with a Master of Divinity degree "cum laude" in May of 2002. Bishop Andriy was ordained as a Subdeacon in May of 1998, and as a Deacon in November of 1999 by Metropolitan Stephen Sulyk, He was ordained to the priesthood by Metropolitan Stefan Soroka in December of 2001 in the Ukrainian Catholic Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Philadelphia.

After ordination, he served in several parishes from 2002-2005. In the fall of 2005, Bishop Andriy returned to the Catholic University of America in Washington, DC for studies in canon law. In 2008, he graduated with a Licentiate in Canon Law, having completed his dissertation on the patriarchal tribunal in the Eastern Church.

On September 3, 2017, he was consecrated as a bishop. The newly ordained Bishop Andriy Rabiy was formally welcomed in the Ukrainian Catholic Archeparchy of Philadelphia on Sunday, September 24, 2017. On April 16, 2018, He was named Apostolic Administrator of the Archeparchy of Philadelphia when Metropolitan Soroka's resignation was accepted by Pope Francis.

On November 10, 2022, Pope Francis appointed Bishop Andriy as auxiliary bishop for the Ukrainian Catholic Archeparchy of Winnipeg.



Sunday of the Last Judgement Meatfare Sunday

Fourth Pre-Lenten Sunday

This is the last day of eating meat, traditionally, until Pascha. One week away from Great Lent, we hear the parable of the Last Judgement, the sheep separated from the goats—goodness rewarded and sin punished.

Then the righteous will answer Him, 'Lord, when did we see You hungry and feed You, or thirsty and give You drink? And when did we see You a stranger and welcome You, or naked and clothe You? And when did we see You sick or in prison and visit You?

And the King will answer them, '*Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers and sisters, you did it to me.*'

The previous pre-lenten readings have been leading to this image of the final exam time, as it were, when the teaching, reminders, and mentoring end, and our performance is evaluated. What is the metric for a passing grade?

This Sunday's story tells us plainly that the one criterion by which Christ will judge us is love; love for our neighbour is love of God. Sin is the absence of love. Do we live in love or not? Your (my) humanity develops and thrives only because you have been and continue to be loved. Cruelty, criminality, hunger, and want emerge from a lack of love; caring for others, is how we manifest the Kingdom of Heaven here on earth. This parable tells us that Christ is present not only in our fellow parishioners, family, or friends—He is in every human being, even those most in need. Let's reach out to Him at every opportunity and, like the father of the prodigal last week, let's celebrate being home.

A day of fasting, prayer and almsgiving will be held in all Eparchies and **FERDIARY 2023** Exarchates of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church throughout the world on February 24, 2023. Such an initiative was announced by His Beatitude Sviatoslav, Father and Head of the UGCC, on behalf of the Synod of Bishops.On February 24, a year will pass since the beginning of the full-scale war that Russia unleashed against Ukraine. According to the decision of the Bishops of the UGCC, the whole Church will spend this day in fasting, prayer

and doing works of mercy. There are no separate prescriptions for fasting - it is about restrictions and selfdiscipline according to the capabilities of each believer. "May this day be an opportunity for us to do good to someone: comfort the sad, clothe the naked, warm the frozen, feed the hungry," explained His Beatitude Sviatoslav, speaking about the need not only to fast and pray, but also to do charity. "On this day, let us sacrifice our spiritual efforts and our prayers for the victory of the Ukrainian people in this unequal battle, as well as for our army," urged the Head of the UGCC.

Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) will take place on Saturdays & Sundays before Divine Liturgy. Confessions will be heard in the Family Room, which is located to the left of the sanctuary. 
