

Dear Brother Knights!

As I write this message, a year of war has transpired in Ukraine. The entire world has been affected by the brazen acts of Russia's leaders. Hundreds of

thousands of innocent lives have been taken and millions have been displaced by acts of irrational and brutal aggression. Earthquakes and storms have taken many more. The world economy has been altered by the disruption of fuel and food supply chains from Ukraine, Russia and other places. Inflation, crime, healthcare inadequacies, political polarization, substance abuse and addiction seem to be on the rise everywhere. The world is sick, wounded and battered. What can we do?



The Prayer of St. Ephraim

O Lord and Master of my life, keep from me the spirit of indifference and discouragement, lust of power, and idle chatter.

(Prostration or Simple Bow)

Instead, grant to me, Your servant, the spirit of wholeness of being, humble-mindedness, patience, and love.

(Prostration or Simple Bow)

O Lord and King, grant me the grace to be aware of my sins and not to judge my neighbour, for You are blessed, now and for ever and ever. Amen.

(Prostration or Simple Bow)

(Then, with a simple bow, the following is repeated four times.)

God, be merciful to me, a sinner. God, cleanse me of my sins and have mercy on me. Lord, forgive me; for I have sinned without number.

(Once more, the entire Prayer of St. Ephrem is recited without the usual prostrations.

One prostration is made at the conclusion.)

Why Are There So Many MaiD Deaths?

Gordon Friesen, president of the Euthanasia Prevention Coalition, has presented a very informative explanation of this topic. This article highlights the difference between California and Canada, each of which legalized state sanctioned death in 2016 and have a population of about 40 million.

Lately, the mainstream media and government have been relentless in promoting the great "gift" of medical assistance in dying (MAiD = Euthanasia). Choosing silence on these issues to maintain family peace simply cannot be the answer, since one day we will all be confronted with our vulnerability.

2021 Legalized Suicides

Canada 10,064 California 486

7 Physician Assisted All Physician Assisted

10,057 Euthanasia No Euthanasia Allowed

Why The Difference?

In Physician Assisted Death (PAS), patients must choose and take the drugs on their own. PAS as a personal choice means the patient alone is responsible; others bear no obligation or power.

In Euthanasia, the doctor administers the drugs. Euthanasia is defined as medical care and thus the doctor is responsible, the doctor is obliged to inform and provide, and society is obliged to facilitate.

California allows only Physician Assisted Death. Canada allows Physician Assisted Death and Euthanasia

And So It Boils Down To This.. It All Depends On Who Is Doing The Killing Under Euthanasia in Canada:

- 1. The doctor is obliged to initiate the discussion and push death as a treatment. It is understood as a positive good!
- 2. Consent, then becomes a "non-issue". Why? Because the doctor is a professional from whom the patient is seeking professional expertise and care. If this is what the expert recommends, then consent is virtually irrelevant.
- 3. Moreover, it is then argued that we would be cruel to deny anyone the recommended medical treatment even if they cannot actually consent --- just as we would not deny someone a life-saving blood transfusion if they cannot consent (e.g. because of age, disability or level of consciousness).

Fish Fry 2023 - Synopsis

After a three year pause of no fish fry events, we have reviewed and reconsidered all aspects of our operation. 2023 is a re-building year for our Lenten Fish Fry event. Only three (3) Fish Fry evenings will be held – March 17, 24, and 31.

The two biggest challenges we face, are: resources (physical bodies to help out) and higher food costs.

- Resource-wise, the Knights face fewer "able and willing" volunteers to assist us. Brothers are encouraged to ask their spouses and families for assistance. Volunteers should identify themselves by contacting Br. Bohdan Wowczuk at 204-894-2042.
- Cost-wise, fish has held the largest percentage of our meal costs. (avg. ≈ 2/3 of total) Halibut has become too expensive (\$30+/lb.); All other costs have risen about 12-15% on average.

Much of our food preparation and order processing done in the past, has been retained with a few tweaks made as follows:

- Our "new" fish will be pre-cut Cod loins (≈ 4 oz/pc). (Halibut was ≈ 2 oz/pc.) We will continue to be prepare fish the same as in past, battered and deep-fried.
- No changes to perogies, coleslaw, tartar sauce, or fried onions. French fries will be changed to a new "coated" product recommended at the taste test held 2023 Jan 30.
 - Chowder and dinner roll has been eliminated, due to poor sales, and product wastage.
- Dessert has been changed to white (sheet) cake w/ icing, due to food handling concerns and inappropriate touching of "unprotected" food by the public.
 - Menu pricing confirmed at 2023 Feb 13 Business meeting. Menu layout unresolved.
- Our menu has been simplified, showing our "new" offerings and removing the past "Adult / Child" monikers. (Note: "Adult Halibut Fish & Fries dinner" is equivalent to "Fish & Fries dinner".)
- "Pieces of Fish available for sale" tracking will be required. Because pre-cut fish has no "cutting waste", We now must prepare sufficient fish for our customers and workers, while minimizing any occurrences of over-selling.
- Standard Meals for workers (per our menu) will continue to be offered at no charge. Due to our new requirement for "available" fish tracking, ALL "free" worker meals must be recorded via a "sales receipt" from our order taker.
 - Any monetary contributions for "free" workers meals may be made with the "Goodwill" offering.

Thank you, in advance, to those workers who purchase their meals outright.


