By inscribing and establishing their doctrines and offering themselves as intercessors with the Lord, the Fathers are protectors of our salvation and shepherds of the fold.

You have given all, O thrice-blessed Fathers, to know the Father, the Son, and the Spirit clearly by their works: the Trinity who is the cause of the creation of the world. By your mystical speech you called the first three Councils and then the next four. You have appeared as champions of the true faith, proving that the Trinity is truly the Creator of the four elements and of the world.

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit:

Let us honor today those mystical trumpets of the Spirit, namely the God-mantled Fathers who, speaking of divine things, sang in the midst of the Church a hymn in unison, teaching that the Trinity is One, not differing in Substance or Godhead, refuting Arius and struggling for the true faith. They always intercede with the Lord to have mercy on our souls.

Now and for ever and ever. Amen. (Tone4)

O Mother of God, David the Prophet and Forefather of Christ, foretold in song the great things that would happen to you.
